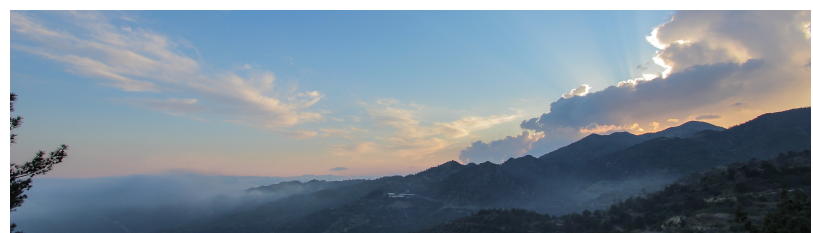
## Experiences

Among other things we were asked to: create a magazine for young businessman, record a short movie or an advertisement connected with employment or with problems young people face at the early stage of their careers or behaviours during job interview. I learned how to write a good CV and what are the jobs which are highly demanded in other countries. Team work taught me a lot. I also met very interesting people which changed my way of thinking. I got new knowledge and I hope I will use it in the future.
